

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

2 JANUARY 2022

FOLLOWING THE STAR TO THE CHRIST-CHILD

The Solemnity of the Epiphany is celebrated this weekend. During this feast we will notice an important addition to our altar crib: the three wise men from the East who have come to pay homage to the infant-king. This is the feast of the manifestation of the majesty and divinity of the newborn Saviour. As early as the third century the Eastern Church, in celebrating the birth of the Redeemer, viewed it primarily as the manifestation of God to man. Hence the name Epiphany, which means manifestation, was given to the feast. Towards the end of the fourth century, as the feast gradually came to be known and celebrated in the Western Church, the adoration of the Christ-Child by the Magi or Wise Men was stressed. Soon these sages were looked upon as the Three Kings.

In the West Christ's birthday had already been celebrated for some time on December 25. But with this feast was associated all the poverty and helplessness of the stable of Bethlehem; Mary and Joseph watched beside the crib in poverty, and the shepherds that came to offer their humble worship were equally poor. This aspect was lost sight of in the Feast of the Epiphany. It is true that the Magi found a poor, weak child, attended by poor parents. But through their faith they recognized and acknowledged the helpless Infant as the Redeemer and King of the world, and as such they adored Him. In the Feast of Christmas Christ is shown as man to a few chosen souls; in the Feast of the Epiphany, on the other hand, He appears to the whole world as God.



Various interpretations have been given for the gifts which the Magi offered the Christ-Child. The tradition of the Church has understood the gold to represent kingly power, incense the great High Priest, and myrrh the burial of the Lord. Their offering, therefore, highlights Christ's threefold character of King, High Priest, and Man. In an ancient homily St. Gregory looked at the gifts from the viewpoint of the givers, and so sees in the gold, wisdom; in the incense, the power of prayer; and in the myrrh, the sacrifice of the flesh.

The Epiphany is the high point of Christmas. If the Feast of the Epiphany is to be fully understood as the Church sees it, it will have to be viewed from two aspects: that of God who manifested Himself to man, and that of man, typified in the Magi, who responded with wholehearted faith and love to *God-with-us*. It is, therefore, a day of faith and grace for all of us.

– GRANT NEWS –

I am pleased to announce that our Parish was recently awarded a grant of **£35,652.06** from FCC Community Action Fund to help towards a much-needed upgrade of our Church heaters and pipework infrastructure. As you know we recently replaced the entire boiler room plant with new efficient boilers. However, in order to benefit from that upgrade, we now need to replace all the radiators, convactor heaters and pipe insulation which are now very old. The parish will need to pay the remaining £8912 to complete the works which are due to begin in stages in mid-November. If you would like to make a donation to this project then please speak to me at the Parish House.

My thanks particularly to Ken Boyle and Ellen Archibald for the work of submitting our grant application and for liaising with contractors. It is hoped that the works will achieve an enormous improvement in the heating situation in our vast church building which has been a long-standing problem for many years. I will keep you posted on further updates. *Fr. Kane*

Marriages

Marriages can be celebrated in the Church with restrictions on numbers of attendees. If you require your marriage to be rescheduled, please contact the Parish House without delay in order to discuss availability on alternative dates.

*It is essential that Fr. Kane is made aware of any change in date or time for your wedding. It is especially important to alert the parish office of any intention to delay or postpone your marriage in light of restrictions.

Capacity restrictions are subject to regular review by the Scottish Government.

One of the most difficult pastoral changes that has emerged from COVID-19 is the restriction now placed on the celebration of funerals. Capacity restrictions is subject to regular review by the Scottish Government.



ATTENDING THE CHURCH DURING COVID-19 UPDATE

ENTERING THE CHURCH

- There is no longer any need to book your place for Holy Mass online. Simply turn-up to the Mass you wish to attend. Our Church is a large, ventilated building which can accommodate large numbers safely.
- The Church will still undergo an enhanced cleaning regime regularly (pews, touch points, doors etc)
- Outside doors will remain open during Mass to ensure good ventilation. This means that you may need to wrap-up warm for Mass, especially as the temperature begins to dip.
- Enter & exit the Church through the middle doors. Please use sanitisers provided.
- In order to gather the necessary details for Track & Trace, you should now 'check-in online using a QR Code attached to the porch posters and attached to each pew. To check-in via the app simply point your smart phone at the QR code and follow the on-screen instructions.
- You are free to sit anywhere in the Church (including side aisles) as social distancing is no longer required. However, please be mindful of others and keep some distance and avoid seats that are cordoned off. You should avoid contact with those outside your group.
- Those attending should continue to wear masks at all times unless exempt. Young children are exempt.
- The First & Second collection baskets will be passed around at the usual times using touch-free poles.

DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

- Please follow the guidance the stewards and keep some distance from others in the line.
- Please use your own personal sanitiser to gel your hands immediately before Communion
- Holy Communion will now be distributed from two or four points at the altar area.
- Once you have received Communion please return to your seat via the side aisle, using whichever side you are seated. The infirm will continue to receive Communion in their seats.

AFTER HOLY MASS

- Please do not congregate in large numbers outside the Church

Please be particularly mindful of those who are anxious or worried about the relaxation of rules.

SUNDAY OBLIGATION TO BE RESTORED

Please read the Pastoral letter from the Bishops of Scotland about the restoration of the Sunday Obligation. This letter is published online. It is worth highlighting that those who are genuinely unable to restart attending Mass due to illness or because of a serious anxiety or fear, should not feel obliged to attend. This important point was stressed recently by a letter Bishop Toal sent to the Parish Priests of the diocese.

CHRISTMAS MASSES

You will see in the Christmas Mass Schedule that we are distributing tickets to attend all the Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Masses. This allows us to manage the numbers attending in a safe way.

If you do not yet have your tickets for a Christmas Mas, you can collect them from the Church porch before or after any Mass, or from the Parish House at any time.

The Christmas collection envelopes will also be distributed at that time. Remaining tickets will be available after every Mass until Christmas Eve.

If, for some reason, you can no longer attend your chosen Mass, it is essential that you return your tickets to the Parish so that those spaces can be made available to others.

I would ask that parishioners try to allow young families to attend the earlier Masses on Christmas Eve. I know this would be a great help to families if they are able to secure those tickets.

CHRISTMAS NATIVITY PLAY

The children of the Ignite Drama Club will perform a short nativity play on the sanctuary during the homily part of the Mass. This will take place at the 4pm Saturday Vigil and the 10am Sunday Family Mass this weekend 18th / 19th December.

BLESSING OF BABY JESUS CRIB FIGURES

We invite you to bring along the Baby Jesus figure from your home nativity set at the following Masses: Saturday 18th of December 4pm Vigil Holy Mass, and Sunday 10am Holy Mass 19th of December. Father Kane will bless the crib figures at the end of the Mass so that they are ready to enter our home cribs when Christmas comes. This is also a great lesson to our children of the importance of the Baby Jesus in the nativity scene.



FREE CHRISTMAS WINDOW CANDLE



This weekend 18th / 19th December every family in the parish is invited to collect a red Christmas window candle to light at home on Christmas Eve during the hours of 7 - 9pm. This is in keeping with an old Irish tradition of placing a candle at the window on Christmas Eve to welcome the child-Jesus when there was no room for Him at the Inn. It is also a 'welcome to the stranger' on Christmas Eve.

I hope the candle serves as a public sign of our Catholic faith at Christmas time and a witness to the real reason for the season. I invite all families to light their candle, taking great care to ensure it is lit safely & never unattended.

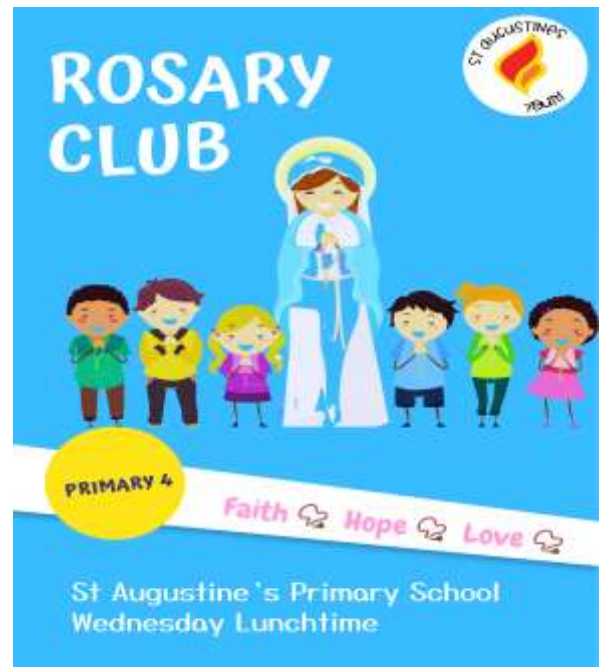
The Sacrament of Confirmation

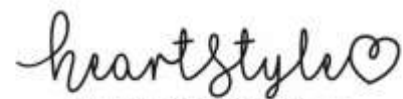

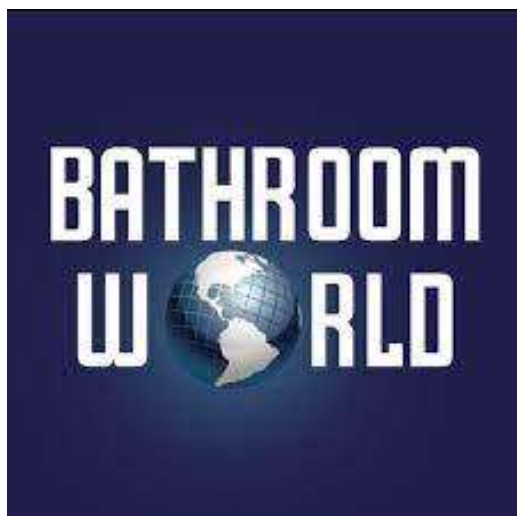
