WORLD DAY OF CONSECRATED LIFE 2025

The World Day of Consecrated Life 2025 was marked at Our Lady of Good Aid Cathedral, Motherwell, with Solemn Vespers and Benediction. This evening of prayer brought together religious men and women, clergy, and laypeople from across the diocese to give thanks for the gift of consecrated life and to pray for its renewal.

During the service, Bishop Joseph Toal reflected on the vital role of religious life in the Church, recognising the dedication and witness of those who have given their lives entirely to Christ. He said:

"We prayed for religious throughout the world. We were praying too for the renewal of religious life and that others will feel called to give their life to Christ in this way by serving him."

The evening was a powerful reminder of the richness of consecrated life and the many ways in which religious communities serve the Church and society.

POPE FRANCIS ANNOUNCES HE WILL WRITE APOSTOLIC EXHORTATION DEDICATED TO CHILDREN

3rd February, 2025 was a day dedicated to children. The Vatican held its first-ever International Summit on Children's Rights in the Apostolic Palace with the presence of Pope Francis, advocates, and heads of NGOs.

Speakers from all over the world came to discuss the global crisis of millions of children without basic human rights. The message that rang throughout the Summit was that "nothing is worth more than the life of a child."

In a world marked by poverty, war, lack of education, and exploitation, children everywhere face injustice and vulnerabilities. Pope Francis expressed his gratitude to all the participants and speakers for making "the rooms of the Apostolic Palace an 'observatory' focused on the reality of childhood worldwide."



More than simply a place to observe, the Pope described the Summit as "a laboratory" and highlighted a phrase Fr. Ibrahim Faltas, Vicar of the Custody of the Holy Land, used: "Children are watching us." He explained children are watching "us to see how we move forward in life."

The Pope closed his reflection explaining he intends to write an Apostolic Exhortation dedicated to children to "give continuity to this commitment and promote it throughout the Church."

Seven panels covered a range of topics: from children's rights in the modern world and access to education to the right to free time and the right to food and healthcare.

In one of the first messages on the rights of children in the modern world, Queen Rania Al Abdullah of Jordan exhorted the international community to care for every child no matter their situation. She stressed that was the promise the world made to children because "every child has an equal claim to our protection and care."

"Children are the beauty of the world," the President of GKSD Investment Holding Group, Kamel Ghiribi, stated. He argued we must look beyond simply finding the solution to hunger and injustice for children, "we must seek to find the problem behind the problem; the why."

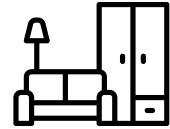

Sr. Briega McKenna

SISTER BRIEGA MCKENNA, O.S.C was born in Ireland and entered the Sisters of St. Clare at the age of fifteen. Following her final vows and after suffering for more than three years with rheumatoid arthritis, she was transferred to her community in Tampa, Florida, hoping that the Florida sunshine would relieve her suffering. At the age of twenty-four, she was miraculously and instantaneously healed during the celebration of the Eucharist and some time later received, in prayer, the gift of healing for which she has become so widely known. In 1974, again during prayer, she was given a deep spiritual insight into the mystery of the call to priesthood. Since then, bishops and priests in many parts of the world have invited her to speak and minister at their retreats and conferences. Sr. Briega ministered to priests in collaboration with Fr. Kevin Scallon, CM for over forty-two years until his death in June 2018. She now continues with this ministry working with Fr. Pablo Escriva de Romani. Her books "Miracles Do Happen" and "The Power of the Sacraments" have been translated into many languages throughout the world.

FR PABLO ESCRIVA DE ROMANI was born in Spain and ordained in Madrid 2009. He studied Theology in the Faculty of San Damaso in Madrid, Spain. He worked predominantly with the youth in the parish of St. Teresa of Jesus in Madrid for several years. After that period, he went to Ukraine as a missionary, working with Bishop Jan Sobilo in the Shrine of Merciful God the Father, giving retreats and helping people from the war zone, pro-life missions with doctors, and spiritual exercises for priests. Fr. Pablo has been ministering at retreats as a missionary in different countries, including France, Mexico, Italy, Poland, Belarus, Switzerland, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Ethiopia, Dominican Republic, USA, Belgium, Lebanon, Holy Land, Guatemala, Chile, Portugal, Puerto Rico, Ukraine, and Costa Rica. He is now working as a diocesan missionary from Madrid in Costa Rica, residing with Bishop Javier Roman in the Diocese of Limon and helping in the indigenous zone, working with youth and giving spiritual exercises to priests. He is now beginning to restore a retreat house to receive priests willing to have a missionary experience and renew their priesthood. Additionally, Fr. Pablo has joined Sr. Briega in ministering to priests and at parish missions.





This May, pupils from S1 at St. Ambrose High School will be traveling to Lourdes, a place of great significance for Catholics worldwide. Lourdes is where Our Lady appeared to St. Bernadette, and it has since become a destination for pilgrimage, prayer, and healing.

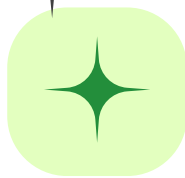

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK / HOSPITAL VISITATIONS

Those who require the Sacrament of the Sick at home should contact the Chapel House to arrange for a visit from Fr. Kane. This should ordinarily be arranged prior to any prolonged hospital visit.
