We have also linked with the local Citizens Advice Bureau who offer advocacy services via our Pantry.

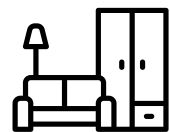

S1 Lourdes Trip 2026

This April, the St Augustine's Youth will travel to Lourdes on pilgrimage, joining thousands of pilgrims from around the world who come seeking faith, hope, and renewal.

Over the course of the pilgrimage, our young people will learn about the life of St Bernadette, visiting the places where she lived and grew up, and spending time at the Grotto of Massabielle, where Our Lady appeared to Bernadette in 1858.

Since the apparitions of 1858, millions have travelled to Lourdes each year to pray at the Grotto, take part in the candlelight procession, and draw water from the spring. It is a place where young people often discover a stronger sense of compassion, service, and belonging within the Church.

By attending and supporting these events, you are directly helping our young people take part in this pilgrimage. Your encouragement, prayers, and practical support truly make a difference as they prepare to journey to Lourdes this April.

Burying the Alleluia

On Sunday, 15 February 2026, the children at 10.00am Mass will create an image of the word Alleluia. They will then go together after Mass to bury their Alleluia, as it is omitted from the Lenten liturgy.

The practice of burying the Alleluia enriches and shapes prayer and the sense of discipline as we anticipate Easter. It is a kind of fasting—letting the “Alleluia” lie dormant before the burst of joyful affirmation of the Resurrection.

Update on Project Wellspring at Saint Augustine's Parish

During 2024 the Diocese of Motherwell launched an important initiative aimed at igniting parish renewal and addressing many of the challenges facing the church at the current time. This initiative is called Project Wellspring.

At St Augustine's we have fully embraced Project Wellspring and are playing an active role in bringing about change, both in our parish and across the wider diocesan community.

Following a period of reflection and analysis – and with direct input from parishioners – we identified a number of priority initiatives that we believe can play a pivotal role in driving parish renewal and evangelisation here at St Augustine's. These initiatives form the basis of the fundamental aspects of parish life;

- Worship
- Ministry
- Community
- Evangelisation and Discipleship

An important point to stress is that these priority initiatives under Project Wellspring are over and above all of the great work that is already underway at St Augustine's, such as our core religious services and all of the fantastic endeavours under our social outreach programme.

Teams are now established and delivering this programme of parish renewal and evangelisation. In this communication we provide a brief update on how things are progressing. We hope you find it to be both informative and useful. It's never too late to get involved; therefore, if you would like to help in any way with the delivery of the parish plans, please speak to a member of the parish team.





A reminder of the priority initiatives for St Augustine's

The table below summarises the key initiatives that are underway in support of each of the four fundamental aspects of parish life.

WORSHIP

- Promote worship in parish homes
- Provide regular Masses for the sick
- Extend our early morning Mass offering
- Create an alternative to Saturday morning confessions
- Identify opportunities to create major events

MINISTRY

- Use Ignite as gateway for children to Ministry
- Take P7 groups into Outreach projects (link to the Pope Francis Award)
- Create and run 'sign-up' Sunday
- Establish a framework for parish Ministry, ensuring an inclusive and diverse mix of parishioners

COMMUNITY

- Establish a bereavement group
- Put in place a Justice and Peace Coordinator
- Put in place an ecumenical coordinator
- Look at how we might provide transport for people who need it

EVANGELISATION AND DISCIPLESHIP

- Create an annual Mission
- Create a Biennial Mission for the School
- Run retreats and develop these retreats into Scripture groups/cells
- Set up a Grandparents group
- Send a 'Welcome Pack' to every parish home
- Promote families taking ownership of faith outside the Church
- Build on Carlo Acutis' legacy
- Implement the 'super Sunday' model
- Put in place a Caritas Coordinator
- Establish a First Year Lourdes group

Progress with our key parish initiatives

Over the course of the last year or so we have made significant progress on a number of these initiatives. At parish level we have put in place a core steering group to plan and coordinate delivery of our priority activities. We have also appointed leaders to each of the four workstreams in order to provide focus on what needs to be done under each strand.

Worship

Under the Worship workstream we can report progress as follows:

- Masses for the sick were diarised and delivered during 2025 – 4th April, 13th September and 15th November.
- 7am Mass established as a regular weekly service on Wednesday mornings, with daily early morning Masses during the seasons of Advent and Lent.
- Eucharistic adoration in parish homes was introduced during the month of November.

Priorities looking ahead under this workstream include exploring how we might expand our regular confession offering with penitential services, looking at additional high-impact spiritual events that we can introduce to the parish calendar and analysing the impact of our initial rollout of Eucharistic adoration at home.

Ministry

Under the ministry workstream we have delivered the following:

- Fully established our Ignite programme for young people preparing to receive the Sacraments as a fundamental pillar of spiritual support. This programme is now being shared with parishes across the diocese as an exemplar of best practice.
- Increased numbers of children attending Children's Liturgy.
- Held three family events spread through the year – organised by the Children's Liturgy and Ignite volunteers.
- Delivered a highly successful 'sign up' event in February 2025 to enlist parishioners to help in all of the various clubs and activities that operate across the parish.
- Introduced our young people to aspects of our social outreach activity in line with the Pope Francis Award.
- Established an annual pilgrimage to Lourdes for former pupils of St Augustine's primary school now in S1. Feedback from our inaugural pilgrimage in May 2025 was highly encouraging.

Priorities looking ahead under this workstream include planning for our 2026 S1 pilgrimage to Lourdes and looking at how we can develop a framework for various ministries.

Community

Under the Community workstream we can report progress as follows:

- A bereavement group has been established, and support materials have been procured to help implement the programme. Visits to bereaved families were initiated in November to help support the families who have lost loved ones, and a schedule has been developed to ensure that grieving families will receive a visit.
- Established underpinning links at the diocesan level in order to support our ecumenical efforts and to help promote key issues relating to justice and peace, both at parish level and at a wider level.

Priorities looking ahead under this workstream include expanding progress made on ecumenism and justice and peace to embed more fully at parish level.

Evangelisation and Discipleship

Under the Evangelisation and Discipleship workstream we have delivered the following:

- Held a Parish Mission, which took place in March of 2025.
- Launched a mission for our primary school pupils that took place in November of 2025.
- Introduced a series of intergenerational services that involved our primary school children inviting grandparents and other family members along to special Masses with a social element afterwards in the parish centre.
- Produced and distributed a parish information booklet to homes across the parish as part of our 2024 Christmas programme.
- Delivered a programme of school retreats, encompassing a range of venues.
- Appointed a Caritas Coordinator to work in our schools on behalf of our young people.
- Organised a parish outing to Newcastle in December 2025, combining spiritual and social aspects.

Priorities looking ahead under this workstream include looking at ways of expanding ownership of faith outside of the church through initiatives such as the travelling Rosary and the travelling Crib, building on faith-sharing opportunities arising from the legacy of Saint Carlo Acutis and linking in with the Ministry workstream to help plan and deliver the 2026 S1 Lourdes pilgrimage.

Looking ahead to 2026

During the coming year we will continue to push ahead with all of the various activities planned to support parish renewal and evangelisation. As a parish we can all be rightly proud of the excellent progress that has been made so far, but there is much more to be done as we look ahead.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK / HOSPITAL VISITATIONS

Those who require the Sacrament of the Sick at home should contact the Chapel House to arrange for a visit from Fr. Kane. This should ordinarily be arranged prior to any prolonged hospital visit. In cases of emergency where you or a family member require the pastoral assistance of the Chaplain, please request this from the hospital nursing staff. The family should make this request clearly to nursing staff.

CATHOLIC TEACHER APPROVAL

Those wishing to teach in the Catholic sector are reminded that it is first necessary to obtain approval from your parish priest to show that you accept and live the Catholic faith. For those living within the parish of St. Augustine's this means approval from Fr. Kane. This applies to those about to enrol for the teaching course, those starting out as probationary teachers, and all those applying for new posts (promoted or otherwise) within a Catholic school. Please contact Fr. Kane if you have any questions about this process.
